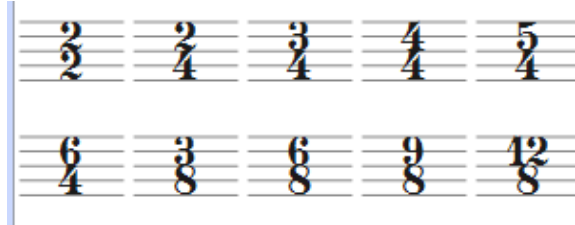
Always Learning

The joy of singing is within us all ! It lifts our hearts and unites us in spirit.

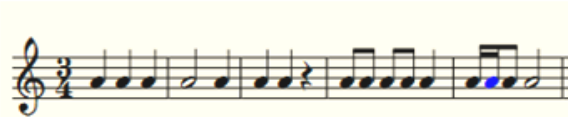
We are now discovering that understanding and mastering the basics of music theory and production will add both depth and precision to our performances. Right now we are especially concentrating on reading rhythms accurately and interpreting time signatures. We will be adding words to rhythmic notation in small groups in the next few weeks.

This combined with the application of suggestions that were made during our individual PVI's, has made our sound significantly improved. Best of all, we are excited about all the learning and the new improved finished product.

Time Signatures



Most Barbershop scores use 2 of the above Time Signatures. Can you pick which ones without looking at your sheet music?



The top number represents the number of beats per measure and the bottom number stands for the type of note that counts for one beat.

For example if 2 is the bottom number then a half note would count for one beat. If 4 is the bottom note then a quarter note counts for one beat in the measure.
